The Program of Mortuary Science, under the administration of the Medical School, offers a B.S. degree with a major in Mortuary Science. The program consists of two years of preprofessional coursework, followed by two years in the professional program. To be considered for admission, students must complete the high school preparation requirements, preprofessional requirements, 60 semester credits, and have a minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA. Students may be admitted to the professional program ONLY Fall semester. Application submission by March 1 is strongly encouraged; applications are reviewed as received, and are accepted up to July 15, or until the Fall class has been filled, whichever is sooner.

Application/Admission Information

- Applicants must have completed 60 semester credits with grades of A, B, C, or S prior to admission.
- Must satisfy U of M high school preparation requirements.
- All prerequisite courses must be completed prior to admission.
- As of Fall 1994, no D grades will be accepted in prerequisites or liberal education courses for the degree.
- Must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 to be considered for admission.
- U of M students apply by filing the Application for Undergraduate Change of College form in 200 Fraser Hall (624-1111).
- Non-U of M students apply by filing the Application For Transfer Admission to the University of Minnesota form either on-line, or submitted to the Office of Admissions in 240 Williamson (625-2008).
- Requests for waiver of a course requirement or a course evaluation should be directed to the program office in A-275 Mayo.
- Students are admitted ONLY Fall Semester. Application submission by March 1 is strongly encouraged; applications are reviewed as received, and are accepted up to July 15th, or until the Fall class has been filled, whichever is sooner.
